### Overview of Current Articles

Each of the four articles in this issue contributes to our understanding of people - users and IS professionals in the management of information technology.

Rao and Dennis in "Equality of Reticence in Groups and Idea Generation: An Empirical Study" studied equally or unequally reticent subjects in idea generation. They found that electronic brainstorming produced more ideas than did oral brainstorming.

Karuppan in "Training Super Users in Large Health Care Facilities" examines learning styles as a basis for tailoring training to the needs of super users. Her results suggest that the popular hands-on approach favors individuals with certain learning styles.

Peterson and Kim's "Information Systems Objectives: Effects of Experience, Position Level, and Education on Developers" studied how IS developers perceive the importance of different objectives of information systems. They found that IS developers view objectives at the system and organizational level as more important than objectives associated with the user and strategic levels.
